the plane is not so hot as it was.

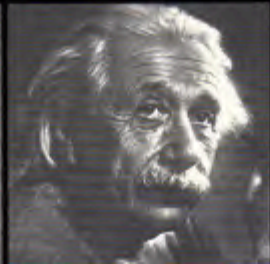
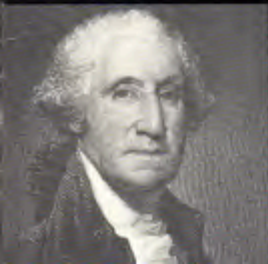

84. **EARHART, AMELIA.** (1898-1937) American Aviatix. First woman to make a solo-flight across the Atlantic on May 21, 1932. In 1937 Earhart disappeared while making her second attempt at a flight around the world. Rare ISP, 8x10", b/w This wonderful and uncommon photo catches her as a lady dressed up with pearls in a feminine dress, yet her eyes show the determination that made her the great pioneer she was. Earhart writes: "To Desse. in memory of a pleasant interview - Amelia Earhart." \$3,350

85. **RICKENBAKKER, EDDIE.** (1890-1973) American leading ace of WWI with 26 victories. Awarded the Medal of Honor Signed book Rickenbakker an autobiography Hard cover, 458 pages, dated and boldly signed: "Eddie Rickenbakker" The only defect is a corner removed from title page, otherwise book and dust jacket are in excellent condition. \$130

86. **CARTER, JIMMY** (b. 1924) 39th US President. Signed check, Plains, GA, dated November 11, 1959 Personally written during the period Carter took over the family's warehouse and cotton gin after his father's death, the check is stamped "CARTERS WAREHOUSE." Although the stamp runs into the signature slightly, it does not detract from the bold signature in blue ink of the President, later known for peace negotiations between Israel

81. **REEVES, GEORGE.** Actor The original Superman, also played in *Gone With the Wind*. Rare ink signature, in perfect condition. \$850.

82. **POWER, TYRONE.** (1913-1958) Regarded as the most handsome leading man. Power appeared in nearly 50 films, including *The Razor's Edge* and *The Sun Also Rises*. SP, b/w, 8x10", movie still captures Power in profile in *A Yank in the R.A.F.*, a film he starred in with Betty Grable and John Sutton. The signature is very large and bold, light smudge on the first letter of signature. \$285

83 **STEINBECK, JOHN.** (1902-1968) American Author and Nobel Prize winner. Works include *The Grapes of Wrath*, *Of Mice and Men*, and *East of Eden*. Signed book *The Log From the Sea of Cortez*, published in 1941, after sailing in a sardine boat with his biologist friend Edward F Ricketts to collect marine invertebrates from the beaches of the Gulf of California. This day-to-day story of the trip is given in the Log, and combines the great minds of a biologist and novelist - bringing together science, philosophy and adventure. That same year, Steinbeck was awarded the Pulitzer Prize. Inscribed and signed: "For *Freddy March, Beware, John Steinbeck*" \$445



159A. NIXON, RICHARD M. (1913-1994)
37th US President. Scarce Nixon ALS, 1p, on personal letterhead "RICHARD NIXON", 10 1/2 x 7 1/4" This letter embodies Nixon's most important character traits: determination and strong will. In many ways, Nixon spent his whole life climbing, falling, recovering, ascending to new heights, only to fall again to repeat the cycle, but always making a come back.

He was one of the youngest Vice-Presidents in US history. Following that, he fell from public grace, only to come back again to win the US Presidency, and to fall again. After the Watergate scandal, he did the impossible climbing once more out of the abyss, and recreating himself as an elder statesman.

In his last speech as a President he said, "I have never been a quitter...It is abhorrent to every instinct in my body." In our letter, Nixon writes to a friend, a Republican businessman who has fallen into financial troubles, telling him what he himself always believed, that despite setbacks, he would soon have "renewed energy to fight new battles in the future." Nixon writes entirely in his hand:

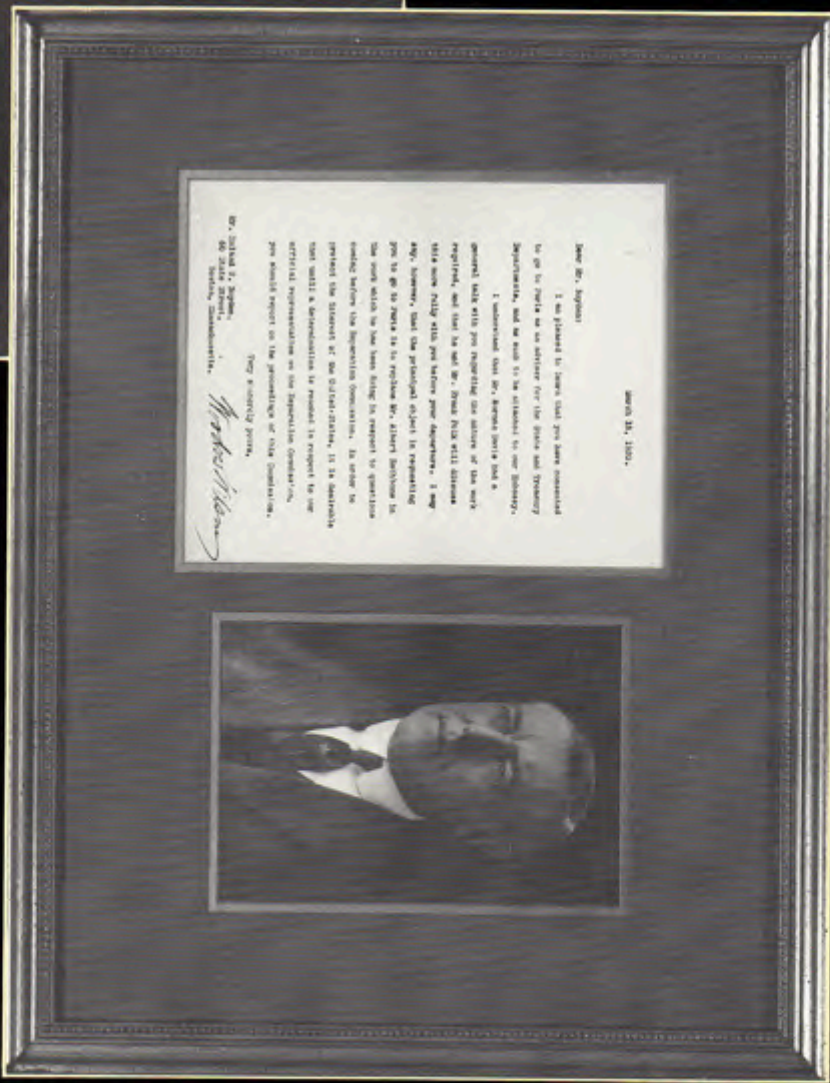
